

#### **PURPOSE**

- To provide equitable access and intentional retention of teacher candidates
- To support students enrolled in initial teacher licensure programs in the College of Education
- To increase the number of teachers serving underserved populations as well as reducing educational disparities in classrooms across Tennessee

#### **ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES**

- Recruit, support, retain, graduate, and promote 50 teacher candidates over a three-year period who will teach in the state of Tennessee.
- Engage teacher candidates in social and professional activities alongside campus and community partners.
- Help teacher candidates successfully attain Education degrees, teaching licenses, and employment within the network of approved underserved and rural Tennessee communities.

- Collaborate with partner districts to identify and recruit prospective students.
- Support Teach Back Scholars in achieving admission to the Teacher Education Program.
- o Provide Praxis Core exam preparation support.
- o Provide financial resources for test and background check expenses.

- Retain Teach Back Scholars once they are in the Teacher Education Program.
- o Provide academic, tutoring, and mental health resources.
- Support Teach Back Scholars through graduation, licensure, and induction.
- o Provide licensure and edTPA support.
- o Provide career prep support.
